### When Using the Product

- Before you start using the product, be sure to read the "Safety Precautions" to ensure correct use.
- Before you assume that the product is malfunctioning, check for possible remedies in the following au Customer Support site of au homepage:

- Communication is not possible even inside the service area in places where the signal does not reach (e.g. tunnels and basements). Also, communication may not be possible in poor reception areas. Communication may be interrupted if you move into a poor reception areas during communications.
- Since this product uses radio waves, the possibility of communication intercepts by third parties cannot be eliminated (though the LTE/GSM/UMTS system has highly secure confidential communication features).
- VoLTE (LTE network) by au is used when connecting with emergency organizations within Japan. You cannot connect using 3G (circuit-switched network).
- The product is compatible with the international roaming service.
   Each network service described in this manual varies depending on the area and service content.
- Since the product is a radio station under the Radio Law, you may be asked to temporarily submit the product for inspection in accordance with the Radio Law.
- The IMEI information of your cell phone is automatically sent to KDDI CORPORATION for maintenance and monitoring operational status of your cell phone.

### **Cell Phone Etiquette**

### Use of cell phones is not allowed in the following places!

- Since using the product on airplanes is restricted, follow the instructions given by the respective airlines.


#### Be considerate of people around you

Indicates to select 'Edit' with (\*) and commit with (\*).



## Using au Disaster Countermeasure Application

au Disaster Countermeasure is an application in which you can use Disaster Message Board, Emergency Rapid Mail (Earthquake Early Warning, Disaster and Evacuation Information, and Tsunami Warning), Disaster Voice Messaging Service and Disaster Information.

When the standby screen is displayed, press ● → [Security/Safety] → [au災害対策 (au Disaster Countermeasure)]

The au Disaster Countermeasure menu is displayed. When powering on the product for the first time, agreement to terms of use and an initial settings screen are displayed. Follow the on-screen instructions.

## **Using Disaster Message Board**

Disaster Message Board is a service to enable customers in disaster areas to register their safety information via LTE NET when large-scale disasters, such as an earthquake whose Japan seismic scale is approximately 6-lower or more, occur. The registered safety information can be checked by customers using au phones, and also from other-brand cell phones. PCs. etc.

For details, refer to "Disaster Message Board Service" on the au homepage.

Trom the au Disaster Countermeasure menu, [災害用 伝言板 (Disaster Message Board)]

Follow the on-screen instructions for registration/confirmation.



- To register the safety information, an e-mail address (@ezweb. ne.jp) is required. Set the e-mail address in advance.
- Deletion of the safety information and configurations for Safety Notification Mail are not available during wireless LAN (Wi-Fi®) connection.
- The Company does not guarantee the quality of this service. The Company, regardless of the cause, shall not be liable for any problems related to registration of safety information due to the concentration of access to this service or equipment errors, any loss due to the damage, ruination, etc. of safety information or any loss arising from registered safety information.

## Using Emergency Rapid Mail

Emergency Rapid Mail is a service to collectively deliver Earthquake Early Warning and Tsunami Warning provided by the Japan Meteorological Agency, and Disaster and Evacuation Information provided by the national government or the local governments to au phones in the specified areas.

 At the time of purchase, receiving setting of Emergency Rapid Mail (Earthquake Early Warning, and Disaster and Evacuation Information) is set to "受信する" (Receive). You can receive Tsunami Warning by setting 災害・避難情報 (Disaster and Evacuation Information).

When receiving Earthquake Early Warning, secure your safety and act composedly according to the surrounding situations. When receiving Tsunami Warning, leave sea coasts immediately and evacuate to safe places such as hills and strongly-built tall buildings.

## From the au Disaster Countermeasure menu, [緊急速報メール (Emergency Rapid Mail)]

The inbox is displayed. Select a mail to check to display the details of the mail.

- When you receive Emergency Rapid Mail, you will be notified by the dedicated alarm tone and the vibrator. The alarm tone cannot be changed.
  - \* When you receive Earthquake Early Warning, you will be notified by the alarm tone, voice ("地震です" (Jishin-desu) ("Earthquake!")) meaning that an earthquake has occurred and the vibrator.
  - \* When you receive Tsunami Warning, you will be notified by the alarm tone, voice ('津波です' (Tsunami-desu) ('Tsunami!')) meaning that a Tsunami is approaching and the vibrator.
- The alarm tone does not ring if Emergency Rapid Mail is received during a call.
- © Earthquake Early Warning notifies areas where a strong shaking (Japan seismic scale 4 or more) is expected when an earthquake whose maximum Japan seismic scale is predicted of 5-lower or more has been detected.
- This service detects an earthquake (P-wave, preliminary tremors) near the seismic center immediately after the earthquake occurs and automatically calculates its location, scale and predicted strength of the shaking. After that, you will be notified of the earthquake as soon as possible within a few seconds to dozens of seconds before a strong shaking from the earthquake (S-wave, principal shock) occurs.
- O In the vicinity of the seismic center, a strong shaking may reach you before Earthquake Early Warning.
- Tsunami Warning notifies areas including target sea coasts of Major Tsunami Warning and Tsunami Warning provided by the Japan Meteorological Agency.
- Disaster and Evacuation Information notifies information related to the safety of citizens, such as evacuation advisories, evacuation orders or various alarms delivered by the national government or the local governments.
- This service is available only in Japan (Not available overseas).

- © Emergency Rapid Mail is free of both information charges and communication charges.
- As for this service, the Company shall not be liable for any damage incurred on the users resulted from failure or delay of information delivery due to communication disturbance or system failure, contents of the information or other problems that are not supposed to be blamed on the Company.
- © For details on Earthquake Early Warning and Tsunami Warning provided by the Japan Meteorological Agency, refer to the agency's homepage.

- © Emergency Rapid Mail cannot be received while the power is turned off.
- © Emergency Rapid Mail may not be received when you are in a place where the signal cannot be received (e.g. tunnels and basements) or the signal is weak, even within the service area.
- © Emergency Rapid Mail which failed to be received will not be able to be received again.
- The Earthquake Early Warning distribution system provided by this service is different from that provided by TV, radio and other communication media and thus the arriving time of Earthquake Early Warning may be different among those media.
- O Information intended for the areas of other than your present location may be received.

### Using Disaster Voice Messaging Service

Disaster Voice Messaging Service is a service to record voices with a cell phone and deliver them as a voice message to people to whom you want to deliver the information that you are safe when large-scale disasters occur.

#### From the au Disaster Countermeasure menu, [災害用 音声お届けサービス (Disaster Voice Messaging Service)]

Follow the on-screen instructions.

#### Sending voices (Send)

Select "声をお届け" (Send voices) and then "あて先入力"\* (Enter recipient) → "声を録音" (Record voices to send).

\* You can also select the recipient from the phone book.

#### ■ Receiving voices (Receive)

You will be notified via a pop-up screen or an SMS that a voice message has been received. You can listen to the message by receiving (downloading) and playing the voice message.

- If the recipient's cell phone does not have an au災害対策 (au Disaster Countermeasure) application activated that supports 災害 用音声お届けサービス (Disaster Voice Messaging Service), SMS is sent instead.
- If the receivers are notified via an SMS, the information will not be saved in the au Disaster Countermeasure application.

## **memo**

- To use this service via Wi-Fi®, making initial settings via 4G (LTE) networks is required.
- O Voice messages can be recorded for up to 30 seconds.
- Voice messages can be exchanged among au cell phones as well as other-brand cell phones and PHS devices.

- O Voices may not be heard when the media sound volume is set to low or the product is in manner mode.
- When no free space is left on the internal memory, voice messages may not be saved or played.
- $\ensuremath{\mathbb{Q}}$  Some cell phones cannot receive voice messages. For details, refer to the au homepage.

## Safety Precautions (Observe Strictly)

- Before using the product, thoroughly read these safety precautions for proper use. After reading, store the precautions in a safe place.
- These "Safety Precautions" describe instructions that should be observed to prevent damage to property or injury to the customer or others using the product.
- If the product is going to be used by a child, a parent or guardian should read the "Setting Guide" and "Basic Manual" (this manual) and provide instruction in proper use.
- These instructions are divided into the following categories.

### Explanation of Indications Used in This Manual

<b>ANGER</b>	Indicates imminent risk of death or serious injury*1 with improper handling.
<b>WARNING</b>	Indicates risk of death or serious injury*1 with improper handling.
<b>CAUTION</b>	Indicates risk of minor injury*2 and physical damage*3 with improper handling.

- \*1 Serious injury: This refers to loss of sight, injury, burns (high- and low-temperature), electric shock, broken bones, injuries with residual aftereffects from poisoning, etc., and injuries requiring hospital admission for treatment or long-term hospital attendance as an outpatient.
- \*2 Minor injury: This refers to injuries, burns (high- and low-temperature), electric shock, etc. that do not require hospital admission for treatment or long-term hospital attendance as an outpatient.
- \*3 Physical damage: This refers to extended damage to buildings, furniture, livestock or pets.

Precautions Common to the Main Unit, battery pack, back cover, Charger, au Nano IC Card 04, Peripheral Devices



## Be sure to read the following hazards before use.



Be sure to use only the specified peripheral devices. Use of other peripheral devices might cause overheating, ignition, rupture, fault, or leakage of liquid.



Do not use, store or leave the product in hot places (e.g. by the fire, near a heater, under a kotatsu, in direct sunlight, in a car in the hot sun). Doing so might cause ignition, rupture, fault, fire or injury.



Do not put the product in a cooking apparatus such as microwave oven or a pressure vessel. Doing so might cause ignition, rupture, fault, fire or injury.



Do not throw the product into a fire or heat it. Doing so might cause ignition, rupture or fire.



The customer is not allowed to disassemble, modify or repair the product. Doing so might cause a fault, ignition, electric shock, or injury. The Company is not liable even in the event of any nonconformities arising on the product or peripheral devices as a result of modification, etc.

Modification of the product is in violation of the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law.



## Be sure to read the following warnings before use.



Before entering an area where flammable gas is generated such as a gas station, be sure to turn off the product. Do not charge the battery. Failure to observe these precautions might cause the gas to catch fire. In addition, when using Osaifu-Keitai® payment function at a gas station, be sure to turn off the power in advance. If Osaifu-Keitai® has been set, cancel the lock before turning off the power.



When wearing a metal accessory etc., do not allow the metal part to come in contact with the external connection terminal, charger terminal, or power outlet. Doing so might cause electric shock, ignition, injury or a fault.



Do not drop or subject to strong impact, such as throwing. Doing so might cause rupture, overheating, ignition or a fault.



Do not use outside when you can hear thunder. Doing so might risk lightning strikes and electric shock.



To prevent short-circuiting of the external connection terminal and charger terminal, do not allow your fingers or any other part of your body or conductive materials (metal, pencil lead, etc.) to come in contact with or enter these areas. Doing so might cause overheating, fire, a fault, electric shock, or burns.




If the product is damaged because it is dropped, etc. and its display is cracked or internal parts are exposed, do not touch the cracked display or exposed parts. Doing so might cause electric shock or injury from damaged parts.



Charging the product while wet might cause electric shock or short circuit/corrosion, causing fire due to overheating, a fault, or injury.







Do not use product while driving a car or riding a motorbike or bicycle or while walking. Doing so might cause a traffic accident or someone to fall or drop something. Use of a cell phone while driving a car or riding a motorbike is prohibited by law. Use of a cell phone while riding a bicycle may be punishable by some requiations.



If charging is not completed after the specified charging time, stop charging. Failure to do so might cause leakage of liquid, overheating, rupture or ignition.

When removing the back cover, do not apply excessive force. Doing so might cause injury or malfunction.



Do not expose the camera lens to direct sunlight for an extended period. Doing so might cause ignition, rupture, fire or a fault by the light-collecting mechanism of the lens.



Do not store the product in places subject to direct sunlight (e.g. in automobiles), places that get hot, places that get extremely cold, and in humid or dusty places. Doing so might cause overheating, deformation or a fault.



Do not place the product on top of a wobbly table or sloped surface, or charge when placed on an unstable location. Doing so may allow the product to fall and cause injury or damage. Be careful especially when the product is set to vibrate.

Also use adequate caution with impact, etc. Failure to do so might cause a fault or injury.



The product may become hot when used for a long period or when connected to an external power supply. Avoid contact with the product and specified charger (sold separately) for long periods. Failure to do so may cause low-temperature burns.

Do not cover with paper, clothing, bedding, etc. Doing so may cause fire, injury, or a fault.



When charging the product, do not exceed the ratings given for outlets and wiring. Exceeding ratings for power strips, etc. might cause overheating and result in fire.



Do not use with the back cover removed. Do not leave or store in that manner. Doing so may allow dust or other foreign matter to enter and cause a fault.

Stop use if there is smoke, abnormal odor or noise, excessive overheating, or other abnormalities. During charging, disconnect the specified charger (sold separately) from the power outlet, make sure that the product is not overheating before turning the power off, remove the battery pack and contact an au shop or Keitai Guarantee Service Center. Also, if you have dropped or damaged the product, do not continue to use it in that state, and contact an au shop or Keitai Guarantee Service Center.



When inserting an earphone, etc. into the product, adjust the volume to the proper level by increasing it gradually. Suddenly turning the sound on with the volume set too high, too loud a volume or using the earphone continuously for a long period of time might adversely affect your ears. Also, raising the volume too high might prevent you from hearing sounds around you, which might in turn lead to a traffic accident at a railroad crossing or pedestrian crossing.



When using handsfree call, take care to keep the speaker at a safe distance from your ears, as the speaker volume may be too loud.

#### Main Unit



## Be sure to read the following warnings before use.



Turn off the product or set it to Airplane mode before going aboard an airplane. Since using the product on airplanes is restricted, follow the instructions given by the respective airlines. If any functions are activated that power on the product automatically, disactivate them. Failure to do so might affect an airplane's electronic

railure to do so might affect an airplane's electronic instrumentation. If you commit a prohibited act while using the product on an airplane, you might be punished by law.



Follow the instructions given by the respective medical institution regarding the use of the product in a hospital. Turn off the product in areas where the use of cell phones is prohibited.

Failure to do so might cause interference with the operation of electronic devices and electronic medical devices.



Do not send data by infrared communication with the infrared port pointing toward eyes. Doing so might affect eyes. Also, sending data with the infrared port pointing toward some other infrared device might cause false operation, etc.



If using the photo light/flash light, do not hold it in front of someone's eyes, or point it at the eyes of someone driving a car or riding a motorbike or bicycle. If the photo light/flash light is lit, do not look directly into it. Eyesight may be affected. Be especially careful not to shoot small children from a very close distance.

Use of the main unit in an automobile might sometimes affect on-vehicle electronic devices, though this rarely happens. If this happens, do not use since this may impair safe travel.



If you feel any abnormality with your skin, immediately consult a dermatologist. Itching, rashes, eczema, etc. sometimes occurs depending on your physical constitution and condition.

Do not bring the product close to magnetized objects such as cash cards, floppy disks, credit cards, and prepaid cards. Doing so might result in loss of recorded information.



Do not allow liquids, metal objects, burnable items, and other foreign matter to get inside the external connection terminal, microSD card slot, or au Nano IC Card 04 slot. Doing so might cause fire, electric shock, a fault, or injury.



You should normally use the product with the external connection terminal cover closed. Using the product with the cover opened can allow dust, liquid, etc. to enter and cause malfunction.



Do not swing the product around by holding the strap, etc. Doing so might cause an accident or damage.



If you have a weak heart, be careful when setting the ringtone vibration and incoming volume to prevent adverse effects on your heart.



Pay attention to items becoming stuck to the product. The speaker uses magnets, and so thumbtacks, pins, craft knife blades, staples, and other metal objects sometimes become stuck to the main unit, and cause unexpected injury. Before using the product, always make sure there is nothing stuck to the speaker or other part.



Do not put the product directly on sand at a beach, etc. Sand or other small particles might get inside the microphone, speaker causing the volume to drop. If sand gets inside the product, it might cause overheating or a fault.

#### Battery Pack



## (The battery pack of the product is a lithium-ion battery.)

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Charge the battery before using the product. Also charge the battery after long periods of disuse before using the product.



#### Be sure to read the following hazards before use.



Do not short-circuit the plus (+) and minus (-) terminals on the battery pack.



Do not fail to connect the battery pack to the product in the correct orientation. Connecting in an incorrect orientation might cause rupture, fire or overheating. Do not try to forcibly connect the battery pack, instead thoroughly check the contact terminal before connection.



Do not puncture the battery pack with a nail, hit it with a hammer or step on it. Doing so might cause ignition, overheating, rupture or damage.



Do not allow metal objects (such as necklaces and hairpins) to come in contact with the contact terminal when carrying or storing the battery pack. Short-circuiting might cause overheating, ignition, fire, leakage, or malfunction.



Do not disassemble, modify or directly solder the battery pack. Doing so might cause battery fluid to spurt, causing blindness if entering eyes, etc. or causing overheating, ignition, rupture, or injury.



Do not use a battery pack that has been dropped, stepped on, damaged, or that is leaking battery fluid. Doing so might cause overheating, ignition, leakage, malfunction, or injury. Immediately move the battery pack away from fire if you notice leakage of fluid or unusual odor. Failure to do so might cause the leaked fluid to catch fire resulting in ignition or rupture.



Do not wet the battery pack with water, seawater, pet urine, etc. A wet battery pack might cause overheating, rupture, ignition, malfunction, or injury. If you drop the product into water by mistake, immediately turn off the power, remove the battery pack, and contact an au shop or the Keitai Guarantee Service Center. Never charge a wet battery pack.



Battery fluid on skin and clothes might cause injury; immediately rinse with water. Battery fluid in eyes can cause blindness; rinse with water without rubbing, and immediately and seek medical attention. Wipe away battery fluid on the product without directly touching fluid.



The battery pack is a consumable item. If the performance of a battery pack does not recover (e.g. the usable time after each charge has become extremely short), the battery pack is at the end of service life, so stop use and buy a new one of the specified type. Failure to do so might cause overheating, ignition, rupture or leakage. Note that the length of service life varies depending on the usage condition, etc.



Be careful not to let a pet bite the battery pack. Letting it do so might cause leakage, overheating, rupture, ignition, fire, injury, etc.

## Be sure to read the following warnings before use.



Do not use at other voltages than the specified power supply voltage. Doing so might cause ignition, fire,

- overheating, electric shock or injury.

Firmly insert the power plug of the specified charger (sold separately) into the power outlet down to the base of its pins. Incomplete insertion of the power plug might result in electric shock, overheating, ignition, fire, or injury. Do not use damaged specified charger (sold separately) or loose power outlets.



Do not damage, modify, twist, pull or place a heavy object on the cable of the specified charger (sold separately). Do not use a damaged cable. Doing so might cause electric shock, short circuit, fire, or injury.



If you hear thunder, do not touch the specified charger.

Doing so might cause an electric shock as a result of a lightning strike.

Only use in places not subject to direct splashing with water, pet urine, etc. Not doing so might cause overheating, fire, electric shock, malfunction due to short-circuiting, or injury. In the event that a specified charger (sold separately) is splashed with liquid, immediately disconnect its power pluc.



When not using the specified charger (sold separately), do not leave it plugged into an outlet. Do not wrap power cord of the specified charger (sold separately) around the charger. Doing so might cause electric shock, overheating, fire, a fault, or injury.



Do not forcibly bend the charger's plug or the connection between the connector and power cord. Doing so might cause electric shock, overheating, fire, a fault, or injury.



## Be sure to read the following cautions before use.



Do not use the specified charger (sold separately) in a bath room or other humid environment or plug it in or unplug it with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock, malfunction, or injury.



When unplugging the power plug of the specified charger (sold separately) from the outlet, hold the power plug to do so. If you pull the cable, it might be damaged.



Do not leave the specified charger (sold separately) connected to the product with the battery pack removed. Doing so might cause ignition, electric shock, or injury.

#### au Nano IC Card 04



#### Be sure to read the following cautions before use.



Be careful not to injure your hand or finger when attaching/ removing the au Nano IC Card 04.



Do not subject the au Nano IC Card 04 to actions that can damage it (use in high-temperature conditions, throwing in a fire, allowing metal contacts to come in contact with foreign objects, subjecting to shock, bending or pressing, wetting, etc.). Doing so might erase data or cause a fault.



Do not store the au Nano IC Card 04 in places that get hot (places subject to direct sunlight, etc.) or in dusty places. Doing so might cause a fault.



Store the au Nano IC Card 04 out of reach of small children. Accidental swallow might cause asphyxiation, injury, etc.

## Use near Medical Instruments and Inside Medical Facilities



## Be sure to read the following warnings before use.



When using the product near an implanted pacemaker, implanted cardioverter-defibrillator or other electronic medical device, radio waves might affect these units and devices. So, please observe the following.

- Those with an implanted pacemaker or implanted cardioverter-defibrillator should carry or use the product at least 15 cm away from where the implant is.

These precautions are provided to prevent product faults and to ensure that performance can be fully demonstrated.

Thoroughly read these precautions to ensure correct use.

#### Precautions common to the main unit, battery pack, back cover, charger, au Nano IC Card 04, peripheral devices

Do not apply excessive force to the product during use. Be sure not to put the product into a tightly packed bag or place a heavy object on the product in a bag. Sitting on the product in your pocket might damage the display or internal circuit board resulting in a malfunction.

Keeping an external device connected to the external connection terminal might damage the connector resulting in a malfunction. Such damage and malfunction are not covered by the warranty, even if there is no external damage.

 To ensure waterproof property (equivalent to IPX5 and IPX8) of the product, use the product with the back cover and external connection terminal cover tightly closed.

Note that the waterproof property is not guaranteed in every usage condition.

Do not allow water to get inside the product or splash water on the battery pack, charger, or optional accessories. Do not open/close the back cover or external connection terminal cover in the rain or with any water on the surface of the product. Doing so might cause water intrusion resulting in internal corrosion. Malfunctions determined to be caused by such water intrusion are not covered by the warranty.

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places (Use within an ambient temperature range of 5°C to 35°C and humidity range of 35% to 85%).
  - Charger
  - Peripheral devices

- Do not use the product in extremely hot, cold or humid places. (Use within an ambient temperature range of 5°C to 35°C and humidity range of 35% to 85%. Temporary use at 36°C to 40°C is allowed.)
  - Main unit
  - Battery pack, au Nano IC Card 04 (attached to the main unit)
- Do not use in places subject to lots of dust or vibration.
- Clean the external connection terminal now and then with a dry cotton swab. Soiling may result in a poor connection. Avoid using excessive force, which can bend the external connection terminal.
- Clean the product with a soft dry cloth (such as the type used for eyeglasses). Forceful rubbing with a dry cloth may scratch the display. The display may be stained if splash or smear is left attached to the surface. Wiping the product using alcohol, thinner, benzene, detergent, etc. might erase the printing on the outer casing or cause discoloration.
- Use as far away as possible from fixed-line phones, TVs and radios. Use nearby might affect them.
- The product may become warm while charging or during other operations, depending on the situation, but this is not abnormal.
- Turn off the power of the product before removing the battery pack.
   If you remove the battery pack with the power on, saved data might be altered or lost.
- Do not adhere stickers on the product. Doing so may prevent sound from being audible or your voice from being audible to the other party.

#### Main unit

- Do not forcefully press, tap or intentionally subject the display to strong impact. Doing so might cause scratching or damage.
- Do not forcefully press your fingernails, sharp objects, or hard objects against keys or display surface. Doing so might cause scratching or damage.

- The product's keypad (touch area) can be operated with your fingers as a touchpad (Touch Pointer). However, in the following cases, the touch area may not respond to touch operation. These may also result in malfunction.
  - · with gloves on
  - with fingernails
  - · with another object placed on the operation area
  - · with a protective film or sticker adhered
  - · with any water or condensation on the touch area
  - · with wet or sweaty fingers
  - · under water
- Never use modified au cell phones. Use of a modified device violates the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law. The product has acquired such certification as conformity with technical regulations for a specified radio station based on the Radio Law and conformity with technical regulations for a terminal device based on the Telecommunications Business Law, and the Technical Conformity Mark (♣) can be confirmed internally in the product.
  - When the standby screen is displayed, press → [Settings] → [More settings] → [About phone] → [Compliance information] If the product is disassembled and modifications are made to the internal components, the certifications of conformity with technical regulations will become invalid. Never use the product without these certifications valid. Doing so violates the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law.
- Take care not to place magnetized items such as magnetic cards, speakers and TV sets near the product, as it might cause malfunction.
  - Putting strong magnetism close to the product might cause false operation.

- When you put the product in your pocket or bag, take care so that the display does not come in contact with metal objects or other hard objects, as it might cause scratching or damage. Straps with metal or other hard parts that may come in contact with the display may cause scratching or breakage.
- When suddenly brought into a warm place from a cold place, or when in a humid location, or when used where temperature suddenly changes (e.g. near the air discharge port of an air conditioner), water drops (i.e. condensation) sometimes are formed inside the product. Note that when used under conditions such as this. humidity might cause corrosion or a fault.
- When wiping the display, wipe with a soft, dry cloth. Use of a moistened cloth, glass cleaner or other similar liquid might cause a fault.
- When connecting/disconnecting an external device to/from the external connection terminal make sure to insert/remove the connector of the external device straight to/from the terminal.
- Note that applying unnecessary force with an external device connected to the external connection terminal may cause damage.
- Do not exert excessive force when attaching/removing a microSD memory card. Doing so might injure your hands or fingers.
- While writing/reading data to/from a microSD memory card, do not subject the product to vibration or impact, remove the battery pack, or turn off the power. Doing so might cause loss of data or a fault.
- Do not remove the black sheet on the inside of the back cover.
   Doing so may prevent Osaifu-Keitai<sup>®</sup> from reading/writing properly.
- Covering the microphone with your fingers, etc. prevents your voice from being clearly heard by the other party.
- Covering the light sensor with your fingers, a sticker, etc. may prevent the light sensor from responding to the surroundings and operating properly.

#### Touch area

- Operate the touch area with your fingers. Do not use a ballpoint pen, pencil, or other sharp object. Not only does this prevent proper operation, it can also scratch or damage the touch area.
- Adhering stickers or films over the touch area may prevent the Touch Pointer from operating properly.
- Any soiling or wetness (sweat, water) on the touch area may cause misoperation. Wipe the touch area with a soft, dry cloth.

#### ■ Battery pack

- Use in very hot or cold environments, for example, when left in an automobile with the windows closed in summer, will cause the battery capacity to drop and shorten the available battery usage time. This will also shorten the battery pack's service life. Try to use the battery pack as much as possible at room temperature.
- When the battery pack is not to be used for a long time, remove the back cover and then the battery pack from the main unit, and store it away from hot and humid places.
- Charge the product first if using the product for the first time or if you have not used the product for a long time.
- The battery pack is a consumable item. The battery is at the end of its service life if it no longer recharges. Purchase a specified battery pack. Service life depends on usage.
- Do not dispose of the battery pack with ordinary refuse. Cooperate with battery recycling programs to promote environmental conservation and better use of resources.
- Used battery packs are collected at au shops and other locations.

  Battery packs sometimes swell up as they approach the end of their service life depending on the usage condition.
  - This is due to the properties of lithium-ion batteries, and is not a problem in terms of safety.

#### au Nano IC Card 04

- Do not forcibly remove or insert the au Nano IC Card 04. Be careful not to exert excessive force when inserting the card into your au cell phone.
- You are responsible for any damage caused by inserting your au Nano IC Card 04 into some other IC card reader/writer, etc.
- Keep the IC (metal) part of your au Nano IC Card 04 clean. Wipe the card with a dry, soft cloth (such as for cleaning eyeglasses) for cleaning.
- Do not put stickers, etc. on the au Nano IC Card 04.

#### ■ Camera

- When using the camera, follow common rules of etiquette regarding camera use
- When photographing important occasions (such as a wedding), take a trial shot and check the shot image to make sure it is correctly shot.
- Do not use the camera for recording commercially available books or information of which photographing is not allowed.

#### Copyrights and rights of portrait

- If the data you shot or recorded using the product or the data you downloaded from the Internet etc. is in part or in whole protected by the third party's copyright, you are not allowed to copy, distribute, publicly send, modify the data without consent of the copyright holder, except for personal use, under the copyright law. In addition, do not use or modify portraits or names of other individuals without their consent, as it may infringe on rights of portrait.
  - Note that shooting and recording might be restricted at some live performances, shows and exhibitions even for personal use.
- Be careful about the copyright and portrait right when posting photos you shot, etc. on Internet homepages.

#### ■ Back up content on the product

 Please back up important content recorded or downloaded to the product to an outside source. Content recorded to memory on the product sometimes disappears or is altered by unexpected factors, such as static electricity or a fault, or by repair, mishandling, etc.

#### PIN Code

To prevent unauthorized use of the au Nano IC Card 04 by a third party, you can set the product to require PIN code entry every time the power is turned on. You also need to enter PIN code when setting whether PIN code entry is required.

If PIN code is incorrectly entered three times consecutively, the PIN code will be locked. You can unlock the PIN code using PUK code.

- At the time of purchase, the PIN code is "1234", and entry is not required. You can change the PIN code to any 4- to 8-digit number and the product to require entry if necessary.
- To use the product with a PIN code required, be sure to change the PIN code to your own number you have chosen.

#### PUK Code

In case PIN code is locked, you can unlock it by entering PUK code.

- PUK code is an eight-digit number given at the time of purchase, which is printed on the back side of the plastic card on which your au Nano IC Card 04 is attached.
- · After entering PUK code, you need to set a new PIN code.
- If PUK code is incorrectly entered ten times consecutively, contact an au shop, PiPit or Customer Service Center.
- PIN code is not reset by initializing the product.

## Notes on Waterproof/Dustproof/ Shockproof Properties

The product has a protection rating for water resistance equivalent to IPX6" and IPX8" and for dust resistance equivalent to IP5X" on the condition that the external connection terminal cover and back cover are completely attached. The product also achieves MIL-standard" shock resistance (based on testing by the Company). Specifically, you can talk on the product in the rain without an umbrella (with precipitation of 20 mm/hour or less), as well as use the product in where water is present (bathroom, kitchen, etc.) Before using the product, thoroughly read "Important Items to Remember before Use" and "Tips for Comfortable Use" to ensure correct use. Failure to follow the contents described in these sections may cause the intrusion of water, sand or other foreign material, resulting in overheating, ignition, electric shock, injury or a fault.

- \*1 IPX5 equivalent means that the product will maintain its operability as a phone even if it is sprayed with water from a 6.3 mm diameter nozzle at a distance of about 3 meters for more than 3 minutes at a rate of about 12.5 liters per minute from any direction.
- \*2 IPX8 equivalent means that the product will maintain its operability as a phone with no water getting inside the main unit even if it is gently submerged in a tank of still tap water at room temperature to a depth of 1.5 meter for about 30 minutes.
- \*3 IP5X means that the product will have and safely maintain functionality as a phone after being removed from a test device filled with particles up to 75 µm in diameter and agitated for 8 hours.
- \*4 Drop test carried out according to MIL-STD-810G Method 516.7-Shock requirements as stipulated by the US Department of Defense (product dropped in 26 directions from height of 1.22 m).
  Product shock resistance assumes usage in daily situations; subjecting the product to excessive shock such as by throwing or causing/letting the product fall forcefully may break the product. Even if performance is not affected, being dropped can cause scratches, etc.

Since operation of the product on each usage scene was confirmed based on the above assumption, proper operation of the product in every possible condition during actual use is not guaranteed. Malfunctions determined to be caused by mishandling by the customer are not covered by the warranty.

### Important Items to Remember before Use

- Make sure the external connection terminal cover is closed firmly and the back cover is completely attached.
  - · Water resistance is effective when completely sealed.
  - Any minute particles becoming lodged between contact surfaces (a single hair, grain of sand, etc.), no matter how small, can cause seepage.
  - Never open/close the external connection terminal cover or back cover when the product or your hands are wet.



#### Closing the external connection terminal cover

First reinsert the hinge, and then push in the entire cover (1) with the pad of your finger. Next, press with your finger along the direction of the arrow (2) to close firmly and make sure there are no gaps in the cover.



#### Attaching the back cover

Place the back cover on the product and attach.

After attaching, work your way all around the back cover in direction ①, pressing firmly in direction ② to attach completely.

- Drain any water in the microphone that may be affecting audibility.

#### <In the rain>

You can talk on the product in the rain with wet hands and without an umbrella.

- · Rain refers to "fairly strong rain" (20 mm or less per hour).
- · Any water on the touch area may cause Touch Pointer misoperation.
- Never open/close the external connection terminal cover or back cover while exposed to rain or with wet hands.

#### <In the shower>

You can make calls holding the product with wet hands after a shower.

• Product is not designed to regist water procure. Avoid using where

 Product is not designed to resist water pressure. Avoid using where exposed to high water pressure.

#### <Washing>

You can wash the product under a mild flow (up to 6 liters per minute) of tap water at room temperature (5°C to 35°C) at a distance of about 10 cm from the faucet or showerhead.

- If the product gets splashed with pool water, immediately rinse it off with tap water in room temperature, because pool water contains chlorine for disinfection. To wash the product, do not use a brush, etc.

#### <In a kitchen>

You can use the product in the kitchen and other places where water is used.

#### External connection terminal cover & back cover

#### If any liquid other than plain water gets on the product

If anything other than water (seawater, washing detergent, alcohol, etc.) gets on the product, immediately rinse with water.

You can wash the product under a mild flow (up to 6 liters per minute) of tap water at room temperature (5°C to 35°C) at a distance of about 10 cm from the faucet or showerhead.

If soiled, wash by hand without using a brush, etc., holding the product so that the back cover and external connection terminal cover do not open.

#### After the product gets wet

After becoming wet, drain water, and then without removing the back cover, wipe both the product and back cover with a dry, clean cloth. In cold regions, any water on the product may freeze.

#### ■ Waterproof property

Do not use the product in places where it may be sprayed with high-pressure water (e.g. near a faucet or shower head) or submerge it in water for extended periods of time, as the product is not designed to withstand high water pressure. 

Even after you take these procedures, water may remain on the product. Do not place the product near things that you do not want to wet.

Also, take care not to wet your clothes, bag, etc.






### Smart Sonic Receiver

# Entering a Phone Number and Making a Call

## When the standby screen is displayed, enter phone number

The dial screen is displayed and the number is entered.

## ■ Emergency Call Location Notification

The product supports "Emergency call location notification" so that if you make an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, your current location (GPS information) will be transmitted to the agency receiving the emergency call.



- O VolTE (LTE network) by au is used when connecting with emergency organizations within Japan. You cannot connect using 3G (circuit-switched network).
- In this section, Police (110), Fire and Ambulance (119) and Regional Coast Guard Headquarters (118) are collectively referred to as the emergency call receiving agency.
- This feature may not yet be available at some emergency call receiving agencies.
- If you add "184" before the Japan emergency call number 110/119/118, the emergency call responding agency will not be notified of your location, the same as your phone number.
- In places where signal reception from GPS satellites or a base station is relatively poor, such as in an underground mall, inside a building or behind a tall building, the emergency call receiving agency may be notified of some other place different from your actual location
- When GPS cannot be used to notify of your location, base station signal is used instead.
- When making an emergency call to Police, Fire and Ambulance or Regional Coast Guard Headquarters, always confirm where you are, and tell them your exact location on the phone. Note that depending on the area where you are calling, your call may not be connected to the agency having jurisdiction over that area.

If the emergency call receiving agency determines that human lives and health are in danger, they will be able to acquire the caller's location information during the call or within a certain period of time after the call.

### Using ; (Pause) Dialing and Making a Call

Enter the push signals to send beforehand and then press <a href="> d</a> uring the call to send the push signals. This is a convenient feature when using information services and automatic reservation services.

Example: To dial "03-0001-XXXX (bank phone number)" and send the branch "22X" and the account "123XX"

- International call charges are billed together with monthly local call charges.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of Cell Phones

This model KYF31 cell phone complies with Japanese technical regulations for exposure to radio waves and international guidelines on radio wave protection.

This cell phone has been designed in observance of the Japanese technical regulations regarding exposure to radio waves' and limits to exposure to radio waves recommended by equivalent international auidelines.

These international guidelines were set out by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), which is in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO), and the permissible limits include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health condition.
